**Proceedings of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) Meeting
Regarding the Admission of Students in the Reservation Category**

Agenda:

To discuss and deliberate on the admission process for students applying under the reservation category at YSNM College, with special consideration given to the demographic characteristics and local demand, and the necessity of adhering to the applications received through the Chancellor's portal.

Proceedings:

It was noted that an increasing number of students from reserved categories had applied for admission through the Chancellor's portal, which has necessitated a re-examination of the College's admission process.

Key Points Discussed:

1. Demographic and Socio-Economic Factors:

The IQAC acknowledged the unique demographic and socio-economic composition of the area surrounding YSNM College. It was observed that a significant portion of the local population belongs to various reserved categories, including SC, ST and OBC. Given this demographic reality, the College has a moral and social responsibility to accommodate these students in accordance with the prevailing government reservation policies.

2. Demand for Higher Education:

The demand for higher education in the region, particularly among students from reserved categories, has been steadily increasing. The members discussed the importance of YSNM College, as a prominent womens' educational institution in the area, in catering to this demand. Failing to do so could result in a significant gap in educational opportunities for these students, limiting their access to higher education and subsequently affecting the socio-economic development of the region.

3. Compliance with Reservation Policies

The members reviewed the state and central government policies regarding reservation quotas and emphasized the need for the College to strictly adhere to these rules. It was unanimously agreed that rejecting applications from eligible students under the reservation category would not only be in violation of these policies but also against the principles of equity and inclusiveness that the College stands for.

4. Need for Revised Admission Procedure

Based on the above considerations, it was proposed that the College modify its admission procedures to ensure that all applications from students in the reserved categories, as verified by the Chancellor's portal, are duly considered and accepted. This would involve aligning the College's admission policies with the regional demographic needs while maintaining transparency and fairness in the selection process.

Resolution Passed:

- **Admission in Reservation Category:**

The IQAC resolved that YSNM College will accept all eligible students from reserved categories based on the applications received through the Chancellor's portal. This decision is in alignment with the College's mission to promote inclusive education and provide equitable access to higher learning for all sections of society, particularly the underprivileged.

- **Transparency and Accountability:**


The College will ensure that the entire admission process is conducted in a transparent manner, with proper documentation and communication to the concerned students and authorities.
